The 2010 International Convention Host Committee has been lucky enough to secure an agreement with the NSW Government and the City of Sydney to display flags around the Sydney CBD.

They will be hung around the Convention Centre area, in the City, on the parade route and down the main street of Sydney for the week of the Convention. This will promote the presence of Lions to the general public with 360 flags on display for the week of the International Convention.

We are able to offer Multiple Districts & Districts the opportunity to be part of this wonderful promotion of Lions by offering the chance to purchase a Commemorative flag that will include your MD or District's number and Country name.

At the end of the Convention your flag will be sent to you so that you can display it around your MD or District and as a memento of your visit to Sydney. It can be used later, along the front of tables or as a backdrop at projects, hung on walls or off a ceiling in a shopping centre or poles around your towns & Cities.

This will be a great opportunity to gain maximum exposure for the Lions Clubs International, your Districts and your Country during the Convention. The flags are also a great way to welcome your members to Sydney.

Members of your District can have fun finding your banner and having their photo taken under it, you could even run a competition within your District for the best photo taken.

The flags are 4.5mtrs long x 1.5mtrs, made for indoor or outdoor use. See the wonderful example shown (left). Your flag will be printed similar to this example with your individual MD or District & Country name.
